

Here are the must-do experiences for every visitor to Te Puke:

Kiwi360 is a long-established visitor attraction where orchard tours are available to tell the story of kiwifruit. An expert guide provides an informative description of production techniques and nutritional values and also showcases many other fruit and nut trees growing on the property.

The main complex at Kiwi360 includes a popular Bay of Plenty gift and souvenir shop, as well as a large restaurant and café.

Also operating from the Kiwi360 destination is the Aerius Helicopter Scenic service.

For the best view, of all of this unique growing environment, visitors can take an affordable heli flight over the neat patchwork of kiwifruit orchards, across the dairy farms, and along the white sand beaches. to the historic Maori village of Maketu. Maketu is often described as a the birthplace of Maori civilisation in NZ, in reference to the fact the first Maori canoes from Central Polynesia arrived here seven centuries ago.

A visit to the acclaimed **Looking Glass Garden**, with its fairy tale theme, will appeal to young and old. Nearby is the Papamoa Hills Regional Park which offers a rewarding walk with breathtaking

views and an historic pa site dating back to the earliest days of Maori

The **TECT All Terrain Park** is a true adventure playground. A highlight is the **Adrenalin Forest** Experience.

For another exhilarating adventure take a jet boat ride on the Kaituna River. The Kaituna River Jets take visitors deep into the native forests and canyons to experience a native natural world unlike any other river experience in NZ.

For the local Maori iwi (tribes), the Kaituna River is the umbilical chord which connects the coastal regions with the inland 'womb' of Rotorua. The river is a life line which enabled the Maori family groups and warriors, to travel back and forth from Rotorua to the sea, although rapids closer to Rotorua required overland trekking for some part of the journey. The Tapuika people are the custodians of the river and ensure its heath and vitality is preserved for future generations.

Briars Horse Treks will take you through Forest Trails, Deer and Farmland with lovely views. Middle Eire offers a realm of breathtaking beauty. Participate in Archery, Blowguns and Kayaking.

If you just want to relax, head to one of the Regions great beaches at Maketu. Pukehina or Otamarakau.
